# HAVE YOU COMPLETED A FORM FOR ACCESS TO ONLINE SERVICES?

Our Patient Online Services is now taking requests for access to online services. From Saturday 1st July, the way in which prescriptions are ordered online is changing to a much improved system, called 'Systmonline'.

To use this new service, you will need to register for 'online services' with the surgery.

Once your application has been processed you will be provided with a User Name and Password by the Practice. The new system will also allow you to book routine appointments with your named GP and see, with permission, part of your medical record.

To register for online services, you will need to attend your usual Health Centre in person, with the form together with photo identification. (If you do not have photo ID, or are unable to attend in person, please discuss alternative options available to you, with a member of staff).

www.tamarvalleyhealth.org.uk or ask at reception for a copy.

#### **NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH**

The Neighbourhood Watch contribution this month is being written on the eve of the General Election, Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> June. Much of the repetitive manifesto rhetoric has been overshadowed by the barbaric, callous, terrorist attacks at the Manchester Arena and London Bridge. Security is, quite rightly, at the top of the political agenda. Apart from the appalling methods used by the terrorists to cause so many innocent deaths in our society, we are dealing with the sense of outrage that a few twisted individuals could use religion to abuse the freedom and openness of our British society so blatantly. With each incident we pledge our determination to carry on whilst harbouring concern, if not for ourselves, then for relatives and friends in more vulnerable parts of the country. Following the London Bridge tragedy a Police spokesman reminded us that we are more likely to be killed or injured in a traffic accident than in a terrorist incident. It struck a chord! Speeding and reckless driving is not a stranger to St Dominick and many of us feel that we are constantly on the edge of 'an accident waiting to happen'. Road rage isn't just something experienced by drivers, it affects pedestrians as well! In addition to that there are the effects of thoughtless parking. This kind of behaviour produces tension and bad feeling which we can do without in our tight-knit community. Let's keep our roads and footpaths safe along with our homes and our belongings.

#### St Dominick Tuesday Club

Speaker for the June meeting was James Lines on **Hil House Hats** formerly of 11, Bond Street London.

James's great-great-grandfather, Mr A.J Harman, was the proprietor of the family owned Bond Street shop from 1799 into the 1800's until he retired. On Mr Harman's retirement, the shop had to be sold as there were no male heirs in the family to take the business on. In those days a woman was not allowed to own a business. Sadly, with the shop sold and all of the ledgers destroyed, no trace was left behind until the family started to retrieve some items scattered around – one being a hat sent for repair from Queen Victoria but never collected. These documents and the hat are still in existence and in the possession of a family member of Mr Harman. Hil House Hats were used in the production of 'My Fair Lady' and the Beatles used bowler hats from the collection for a film. Charles Dickens referenced a hat from Hil House Hats in his book 'The Uncommercial Traveller'. As ladies were not allowed in the front of the shop, so the Ladies side of the business did not take off and only lasted about nine years. James Lines started to take an interest in the family firm a few years ago. Since then he has been looking out for hats with the family name inside to make up his own collection. He has a good collection of gentlemen's and some ladies' hats and hat boxes. A local gentleman's outfitters in Launceston used to sell Hil House Hats. If you're reading this and have a HIL HOUSE HAT that that you would like to pass onto James, he would be delighted.
