

#### Parish Council report February 2020 (as interpreted by our Roving Reporter)

So in we went and sat down as usual. Missing were councillors Walker and Potter. As Councillor Walker had missed x number of consecutive meetings he had to be re-elected, or not, as the others chose. Unanimously they said that as he had been at sea, maybe even under it, the situation was unavoidable, so he's still on. And they're still one short.

This time I got the front row, there are usually two short rows of chairs put out because it looks hopeful and inviting. A member of the public who is a fairly regular attendee sat by me and another, who was there for an agenda item, sat the other side, and off we were ready to start but suddenly three ladies nobody knew came and sat down.

The chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting and as the first item is "public participation" welcomed them particularly. They are moving to the area and came to find out what's going on really, which was good. The member of public got up and went out. I thought he was overcome by excitement, but he returned with a copy of the Village Diary of events for them, so that was good as well.

There's rarely anything in this participation slot because nothing's happened at that point. I seem to think it was moved to the beginning of the meeting so that people who wanted to raise a point didn't have to sit through the whole meeting first. Sometimes the "Any Other Business" at the end is the best bit, all the wonderful ideas come out then and they miss those.

There wasn't much this month. The usual discussion about the signs, the one on M and S corner which was reported as being too small, is deemed by Cornwall Council to be big enough. No news on the others. Vogus Lane still has off road vehicles driving down/up it. There is still no solution to this, although Councillor Wilkins did say that it was on the St Dominic Heritage Trail and could be unsafe for walkers. No new post boxes have popped up either.

A few dozen potholes were mentioned but it appears you get a quicker reaction if you report them yourself online. This has been brought up before, they must have forgotten. The member of public was allowed to speak and confirmed he had reported potholes and had a response within a couple of days from Cornwall Council. Remember Councillor Potter had a working party on his own because he didn't know the others had cancelled it. Well it was rearranged and this time Councillor Wilkins went on his own. (Councillor Potter previously said he had already been and the others forgot again). Tut tut. Anyway he worked on his own for a while but I suspect the brambles, wild animals are still there. The next rearranged working party is to be when the weather is a bit better, whenever that is. The 23<sup>rd</sup> March is the red letter day when the new cableway work will take place. Further updates and discussions about the shop, which has now had its planning passed, and you will no doubt read about all this elsewhere in this newsletter. Lots of complicated discussion about leaseholders and trustees etc. not for the fainthearted.

Any other business - Councillor Wilkins had been asked to prepare something, which he duly did although everyone else had forgotten about it, with regard to asking the general public if they thought a public toilet would be a good idea, IF the running costs were agreeable and IF there was funding available and IF there was a site for it near the play area. This received a lukewarm response but I believe you are to be asked. One councillor pointed out that in Callington you have to leave the play area and go across the road to walk to the toilets at the bus station. FYI these same toilets are where our people have to go as well at the moment. Oh well, next meeting at the Parish Hall on Wednesday 4th March 7.00. see you all there.
