### **Neighbourhood Development Plan**

**Speak up!** Do you want Cornwall Council telling us how our parish will be developed, or would you prefer some say in what will happen? A Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) would help residents influence future development decisions. Our aim is to develop an NDP by the end of 2023. To achieve this, we need to understand how residents would prefer to see the parish develop in the areas of housing, amenities, transport, environment, business, employment, heritage etc. There will be a public meeting to kick-start everything early in 2022. And we will regularly ask your views along the way. A referendum will be held in the parish to approve the adoption of the final plan. Our first mission is to determine by the end of February whether there is sufficient support in the parish to drive this idea forward. There will be a lot of work involved and we will need help with some of that. It will be vital that everyone engages in this process in some way.

### **St Dominick Community Shop**

The Shop has been enjoying some Autumn fun with our half-term Spooktacular week and bonfire night recipes. Congratulations to the talented winners of our pumpkin carving competition - Pat Bowley, Kealey Hughes & Dani McCracken. Our daffodil yellow tote bags are back in stock but with a little bit of a difference. We have now added our new strapline – a few words that say what the Shop is all about. Looking ahead over the next couple of months, we have a few things planned:

**Evening of 27<sup>th</sup> November** – the Festivities Group has kindly agreed for the Shop to celebrate its 1<sup>st</sup> Anniversary on the same evening as their plans. We will be taking the opportunity to formally open the Shop which has been much delayed from earlier in the year due to COVID restrictions. We will also be turning on our Christmas tree lights and saying a few words of thanks to all those that got the Shop up and running and to our dedicated team of Volunteers that work in the Shop, day in and day out. We will be kicking off at about 6.45pm. We hope you can join us for about half an hour. The Shop will be staying open later that evening.

We will also have a Santa post box in the Shop where the younger members of our community can post their Christmas letter to Santa by 10<sup>th</sup> December and receive a reply from Father Christmas himself!

**8<sup>th</sup> December** - the Recycling for Charity trailer will be in the car park between 9.45-10.00am. Please do support this important project.

**Christmas & New Year opening hours** – our Shop hours will be different on the following days:

- Christmas Day – closed

- New Year's Day – 9.00-11.30

Opening hours on all other days over the Festive period will remain the same.

## ***Observations at the Parish Council meeting - 2021***

So, there we were in the very well-ventilated Parish Hall, 'we' being a flexible number. There were plenty of tables and chairs, the clerk - Jim, and five parish councillors. They were two short, now one more has resigned and two were unwell but fortunately Andrew Long arrived and took up a seat as did our usual member of public and two more who wanted to speak.

Firstly, Diana Greene on behalf of the Festivities committee gave an impassioned plea for the councillors to take the lead on the Queen's 70-year celebrations next year. She told them they were the leaders of their community, the ones everyone looks up to. I feel she must have written this before she left home but we all have to go to Royal.uk to look up picnic on the field etc., so please do this because otherwise it's a heavy burden for five men.

Councillor Long reported that there was no feedback yet from the meeting the councillors had with Cornwall council rep regarding the speed limits. The 20 mph only applied to reducing from 30mph so Tipwell is not included in this although he is looking into the problem there. He had had no members of the public at his monthly surgeries in the hall, two councillors had come in to chat. He is living in hope. Kevin Owen spoke regarding the Neighbourhood Development Plan. Councillors Potter and Fry had attended the joint discussion with St Mellion Parish council, which Kevin also attended. It is Kevin's intention to get a meeting together to see if anyone is interested or willing to help. The council allocated him £200 to hire premises, print a few leaflets etc. There is funding available if the plan gets off the ground.

Now, I have taken this directly from the draft minutes as it is above my head:

"The Clerk displayed a spreadsheet, previously circulated, on the projection screen, with actual figures to 30<sup>th</sup> September 2021, and estimates for the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022. Estimates of Income and Expenditure for 2022-2023 had been included, demonstrating the need for a 2% increase in the Precept. Cllrs discussed the figures, and adjusted the income and expenditure figures, reflecting the need for renewal of the play equipment in Lovells. After debate Cllr Wilkins proposed a rise of 2%, seconded by Cllr Fry. On being put to the vote 4 in favour, with 1 abstention. Cllr Wilkins stated that he would provide the Clerk with an updated copy of the spreadsheet, with the correct allocation of reserves, as agreed by the Cllrs present". I would say that they were trying to set a precept with only five councillors present instead of ten. There had been an underspend because of Covid really, so there was money left over – not millions so it was possible to have a standstill budget and take any required money from the reserves. This was thought to be a bit negative due to the inflation envisaged in the country as whole, so the 2% was proposed which would give an extra £400.00. Someone said that £400 was neither here nor there, what can you do with £400 but they thought the play area needed a tractor. And I think that was that, except it took about an hour and it would be nice to go back to Zoom meetings which are unpopular because they say the General Public can't attend if they haven't got internet access. There are only two anyway, others only come for their own item then leave.

The two councillors on playground duty were missing, one has resigned and one gave apologies, will be chased up. The last report said some posts aren't going to last till next summer.

The noticeboard grant application failed, probably most grants are likely to fail, so might have to buy it themselves. Oh dear. Parish Hall to be asked if they will go halves.

But – two bits of good news. The Water Board have waived the £5549.64 they had billed the council for and the meter is to be disconnected. Also, the defibrillator is to be returned to the wall of the pub on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> November with Councillors Fry and Heslop in attendance. At last!

All I can say is "What a lovely three hours that was"!
