St Dominic Community Emergency Plan

November '23

The Emergency Plan for St Dominic and surrounding areas allows volunteers from the village to assist the emergency services in the event of a significant incident in the area. Such incidents might include widespread fire, weather related emergencies or longer term power cuts.



This leaflet tells you who to contact and what to do in the event of a serious emergency situation in the village.

It provides contact numbers for the St Dominic Community Emergency Plan Co-ordinator and other volunteers also able to initiate this Emergency Plan.

**Before you call for local help you must phone
the emergency services by dialling 999**

This leaflet also provides contact numbers for other services that may be required to assist or to help with household problems.

- ✱ When calling for assistance give clear concise information as soon as possible
- ✱ Assess the situation and provide the precise location of the incident and an indication of casualties or damage
- ✱ Remember the person on the other end of the phone may not have personal knowledge of the local area

Avoid placing yourself in danger. Until the emergency services arrive and only if you feel capable and it is safe to do so, assist with controlling traffic and people.

Give first aid only if you are trained to do so.

Parish Emergency Contacts List

After the emergency services have been notified the next step is to call the first number on the list below to start the Emergency Plan;

Only call these numbers in the event of a serious incident after calling 999

or 112 which is standard across Europe.

If you do not get a reply, work your way down the list until a response is received.

Do not leave a message.

The person taking your call will activate the process of calling out any volunteers that may be required to assist in dealing with the emergency.

A control centre may be established in the Parish Hall. In the case of loss of power, other buildings in the village may be utilised.

Gather information for the emergency services

After contacting someone from the list opposite remain on the scene and assess the; number and condition of the casualties,

-  any vehicles involved,
-  major damage to buildings,
-  blocked roads.






Defibrillators

Two defibrillators are available;

1. In the ex GPO telephone box near the Parish Church. PL12 6TD
2. On the side wall of The Who'd Have Thought It Inn. PL12 6TG

The codes to open the boxes will be provided by the 999 operator. Instruction on use is given when the defibrillators are switched on.

How can you prepare for an emergency?

-  Add the St Dominic emergency contact list phone numbers to your phone contacts. If numbers are updated they will be published on the St Dominic Parish Council website and the St Dominick Facebook page.
-  If you use Facebook, join the St Dominick Chat page. This may be used for key communications in an emergency situation.
-  Download the 'what3words' app on your smartphone and familiarise yourself with it. Emergency services use the references for detailed location.
-  Consider being trained in use of a defibrillator. Free training sessions are organised by the Parish Council on demand.
-  The full plan is available online at the St Dominic Parish Council website. Please take the time to read it together with this leaflet.
