"The Bishop came to St Dominick"

We have said goodbye to the Revd Chris Painter who left being our parish priest in 2023. His replacement is the Revd Andrew Atkins who joined in September 2024. Andy, you are very welcome.

The Induction Service took place in St Dominick Church on 04 September 2024 and proved to be an interesting bit of theatre as well as a religious ceremony. Officially, Andy was "licensed" by the Acting Bishop of Truro, The Rt Revd Hugh Nelson, and then "installed" by the Archdeacon of Bodmin, The Venerable Kelly Betteridge. Andy was installed as "Priest in Charge of the Callington Cluster *Callington, Stoke Climsland, South Hill, and Linkinhorne*) and Assistant Curate of the Tamar Valley benefice (*Calstock, St Dominick and St Mellion with Pillaton*)". The explanation as to why Andy is not today the Priest in Charge of the Tamar Valley Benefice

is that no priest may hold two benefices, and our two benefices do not legally merge into one for another two years.

St Dominick church was packed, and the service began with a welcome to all by the Revd Michael Johnson, Rural Dean of East Cornwall (*East Wivelshire*) and a good old sing song followed with "The Church's one foundation ...". The Bishop, Archdeacon, Rural Dean and Andy then started a 'holy hike' around the Church, led by our two churchwardens, Clare Lee and Jessop Price, who were there to 'protect' the Bishop. First to the font at the back of the church – where Andy was asked to confirm he will baptise new Christians, and he duly poured holy water into the font. Next to the lectern - where Andy was handed a Bible and asked to study Holy Scripture. The 'gathering' then moved to the altar, where Andy was handed the chalice and pattern; this was followed to end the liturgy of 'Licensing' by a move to the pulpit where Andy received a book of prayer and asked that he would always "place prayer at the heart of the community".

What came next made us all realise this service had an important legal component. Andy was asked to swear he "will be faithful and bear true allegiance to his Majesty King Charles the Third, his heirs and successors, according to law", as the King remains the Supreme Governor of the Church of England. Once done, the Bishop handed Andy his Licence. More prayers were said and we then sang to the roof tops "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of creation!" before being dismissed and off to the Village Hall for a more than welcome reception managed by many ladies of St Dominick."

Parish Council Report November 2024

No councillors Brady nor Heslop this time.

This time there were five members of the public with me. They were in two groups, one of three and one pair. The pair had come to see the council with Andrew Long in attendance but he didn't come so there wasn't much point and they soon left. The other three had come with regard to the lack of fibre broadband in some areas. (See separate article), and the clerk said he would write to Andrew Long, as he was still missing.

Then they all went home.

Jim, the clerk, and his laptop were both unwell but soldiered on. We hope they are better soon. There was a bit of planning, as usual we had to look at it on the screen because some hadn't seen it, but it wasn't too onerous. Councillor Brady had sent a report to say she had been to Nannie Rowe's wood and cut back the undergrowth etc. more needed doing, signs need clearing etc., but the usual volunteers are a bit loppy at the moment. They should improve.

The hall car park, that was allegedly wrecked by Cornwall Council is still the same. The chairman had obtained a rough cost for planings but it wasn't clear if this included spreading or whether it was just big piles dumped. Ongoing, as the drains need redoing, the contractor can't get there yet and no one wants people to trip.

START

Good news – Councillor Potter had examined the salt and grit bins and there were no nappies nor dog poo in them.

The gates into the field aren't closing properly – again. This is normally very expensive but councillor Fry is going to examine and tweak the springs, so that will be alright. He also offered to help with erecting the junior goal posts and nets which have arrived. I think the football club thought they were going to be concreted in (that's just what I thought) but he's going to take a couple of Allan Keys to do the job, which will be much more simple. Thank you to councillor Fry.

Not arrived, and not sure why, is Councillor Greene's gate into the field from the hall car park. If anyone spots it when it does come, please will they notify her asap.

Still on the recreation field, there is no "start" sign at the start of the course. I think there used to be a "finish sign" but no mention of that, it might still be there. Anyway, they can make a sign but they need someone to paint "start" on it. A parishioner's name was mentioned but if they won't do it they might get a bit of vinyl, it's not easy to hear.



The "Welcome to St Dominick" sign has gone black, needs a clean. That started a big discussion on whether it could have a chemical wash or a power hose. Power hose came out on top but unfortunately there is no power nor water up there. But as usual Councillor Fry is going to have a go with his battery operated washer and a bowser, although he did think it needed a better water supply. If anyone sees him up there give him an encouraging beep.

Lastly, but not least, Councillor Brown has been working on a plan relating to the community engagement course I mentioned last time. I think it was agreed to have a dedicated Parish Council Facebook Page where you can write comments. As well as that, the Council Website is being updated, beginning with the photos of your elected representatives so you will recognise them. I've just looked and it's not done yet, only Potter and Wilkins are there so far. I think there is to be a dedicated topic each month, so we will see, perhaps you can suggest some. Keep your eyes on the Council website!

Next meeting Dec in the parish hall. They date might be changed, watch the aforesaid website.

Gardening and Nature Notes

Winter usually begins to take hold during December, however there are still jobs that can be done when the weather permits. Apple and pear trees can be pruned as well as currant and gooseberry bushes. Most types of roses should be pruned during the winter, as well as re shaping them. Be sure to remove any dead or damaged stems.

As long as the ground is not frozen bare root trees and shrubs can be planted from now until March and they should establish well. During periods of frosty weather be sure to keep any water left out for birds and wildlife thawed out and of course leave out suitable food.

In the herbaceous borders try leaving some dead vegetation as shelter for creatures such as ladybirds, spiders and woodlice, and also leave some seed heads for the birds. Remember the garden ecosystem needs insects and bugs so why not construct a "bug hotel", of some form to help them overwinter. (Leaving a pile of cut stems can help with this).

Some of the prunings from plants such as holly, laurel and yew could be used to make a seasonal wreath.

Try to avoid turning compost piles during the winter as you could disturb hibernating wildlife such as slow worms, frogs and hedgehogs. Leave this job until the spring when any residents will hopefully have left.

If you have a pond remove any leaves and debris from the surface and trim any dead or dying foliage. Should the pond become frozen over avoid smashing the ice as this could harm anything that is living in the pond. Instead try thawing a small section of the pond so as to allow oxygen to get to the surface of the water (leaving something floating on the surface can help prevent freezing in the first place).

Stake any tall plants, check that fences are secure and move any garden furniture to a safe place. It is worth remembering that come the New Year we will be looking for the first snowdrops and nearly narcissi which proves the point that the garden never really sleeps.






